Supported by sources	The QA hold point is open; discussion sketch C has not been formally issued. A site observation records a visible discontinuity at the bracket. Concealed barrier continuity has not been verified.

Human authority	Rabbit prepared the decision request and its basis. No final human decision or subsequent outcome is asserted for this fictional Case.

Evidence formats submitted: four .eml emails, three .txt site/QA records and two .png images (a discussion drawing and a synthetic photograph). Two attributed human accounts were entered directly. The photograph was excluded from the recommendation's basis.

The full internal pilot report retains source references, unresolved gaps and the analysis trail. The public extract omits underlying files. The Web Pilot remains invitation-only; no access code is needed to read this extract.

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
